**Lonicera periclymenum ‘Serotina’:** This disease/insect resistant variety of honeysuckle is one of our favorites with its beautiful white, yellow and red flowers that are fragrant and attract the hummingbirds! It is hardy to -20 degrees F. and a fast growing vine that will cover your arbor in no time. Can be grown in or partial shade 10-20’ tall. Colorful red fruit in late summer through fall.

**Lonicera periclymenum 'Belgique'**: This earlier flowering honeysuckle has the same fragrant flowers, but blooms earlier in spring/early summer. Also disease/insect resistant and easily grown.

**Lonicera periclymenum 'Harlequin'**: This honeysuckle not only has fragrant orange and pink flowers, but the foliage is also white, pink and green! Beautiful with or without the flowers. And the hummers are still attracted to them.
